Requirements for Entering:

1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all **Fair Rules and Regulations**, located on page 4, for participation in the Woodstock Fair.
2. Only one entry is allowed in each lot.
3. Enter by grade **just completed**. Effort on an entry should reflect the grade level of the child in order to be judged.
4. High school-age exhibitors are encouraged to enter in the adult departments.
5. **2021 Only:** All articles must have been completed within the last 2 years.
6. Due to space limitations, unusually large crafts may not be accepted.
7. All entries must be made or grown solely by the child.
8. Nature work must be collected and arranged solely by the child.
9. Food and vegetable entries must be on disposable plates. No commercial mixes allowed.
10. No live animals, hobbies, collections, Legos, kits or coloring book pages.
11. Any unfinished or soiled article will not be accepted for judging.
12. Judging will be by the Danish System, with the exception of classes SC1-10, X, Y, Z and ZZ.

95. Molasses Cornbread

This recipe was selected to commemorate the 400th Anniversary of the Mayflower's Voyage and First Thanksgiving. The recipe includes ingredients such as rye flour, corn flour and cornmeal that would have been used in the early 1600's.



Ingredients

- 1 1/4 cups King Arthur all-purpose flour
- 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 1/4 cups stone-ground yellow cornmeal
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1 1/4 cups whole milk
- 1/4 cup unsulfured molasses
- 1 large egg
- 1 1/4 sticks (10 tablespoons) unsalted butter, softened

Directions:

- 1) Preheat oven to 400° F. Butter a 9x5x3" loaf pan.
- 2) Into a large bowl sift together flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda. Whisk in cornmeal and sugar until combined well.
- 3) In a bowl whisk together milk, molasses and egg until just combined.
- 4) Add butter to flour mixture and with an electric mixer or by hand, beat until mixture resembles fine crumbs.
- 5) Beat in milk mixture until just combined.
- 6) Pour batter into pan and bake in middle of oven 35 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool cornbread in pan on a rack 10 minutes. Turn onto rack to cool completely.

Submit entire loaf on foil-covered cardboard no larger than 1" from side of loaf.

Wall Hanging

Junior Quilt Contest Rules:

1. This contest is open to all residents of Connecticut.
2. All work must be completed by an individual quilt maker.
3. Work can be pieced by hand or by machine but appliqué must be done by hand.
4. Quilts must be either hand or machine quilted, no hand tied quilts.
5. Quilts may not be made from pre-cut quilt kits.
6. A quilt can only compete in the Association of Connecticut Fairs Quilt Contest once.
7. Participant must be between 7 and 17 years of age at the time of judging.
8. Wall Hanging Quilt perimeter must measure a minimum of 64 inches.
9. Wall Hanging Quilt must include a sleeve for hanging.
10. Wall Hanging Quilt may be applique or pieced. It can be hand or machine quilted, but not tied.
11. An exhibitor can only represent one wall hanging at the State Quilt Contest.
